Burger's Largest To Date

A progress report on the 47-m/154-ft tri-deck *Time For Us* sees the hull and superstructure well under way at Burger, with Vripack and the Burger Design Team having joined forces. Her interior renderings by Vripack have been approved by the owners as well as the shipyard, and are currently being put into motion. The timing of the build has worked in the yard's favour with their recent \$2+ million investment, which included new high-tech computerised joiner equipment such as a custom dual-axis CNC router, CNC support equipment, a digitiser and custom software. The new vessel will

feature a raised panel Honduras mahogany interior with moulded shapes and curved details and Myrtle burl inlaid pillars, which are intended to depict a 'neo' Classical design, framing a concave fish tank that divides the salon and dining area. Her US owners intend to charter *Time For Us*, which will have full ABS certification and MCA compliance. This yacht represents the largest yacht built by Burger to date and delivery is expected to be completed in October 2006.

Diana's Project 410



Diana Yacht Design currently have several yachts on their drawing boards, including a new 45-m (148-ft) motor yacht, project 410. The company has handled all the naval architecture, while styling is by Cor D Rover and interior design by Felix Buytendijk. The yacht, to be built in steel and aluminium by Hakvoort Shipyard, has been designed for long-range ocean cruising and can accommodate up to 14 passengers in her traditional ship woodwork styled interior. Her owner's full width master stateroom is accompanied

by an infra-red sauna and a sea-view jacuzzi. Further features include a swimming platform with a dress and bathroom area, as well as a tender and two jet-skis. Power is obtained by two Caterpillar 3508b engines, which give her a cruising speed of 12 knots and a range of 3800 miles. She will be built according to the highest yacht standards and is expected to launch in mid 2006.
